


participated in talent competitions such as, "Wish Upon A Song,"

FROM YOUR PASTOR...

God keeps His promises. Jesus said He would rise from the dead. St. Paul insists that this promise fulfilled is the bedrock foundation of our Christian faith and life. God keeps His promises. Without this promise, we would be left taking the temperature of our lives every moment to see if we thought they were worthwhile, met our expectations, were filled with the good things we desire, and were rich enough to satisfy us before death claimed us. Some seemingly win and others lose this game. But we are not playing a game.

Christ died to pay the price of sin so that we might be forgiven. Christ lives so that we might live in Him now (through the

Word and the Sacraments), and with Him in heaven. But the one thing we know for sure is this — death cannot end the life Christ placed in us by baptism. We do not live a life of what ifs or what might have been, but what is. Sin is real but God's forgiveness is even more real. Disappointment in this life is real but God cannot disappoint us. Death is real but the life of Christ is so powerful it could not hold Him and it will not hold us!

Easter is not simply a gift and a blessing for life's end but the riches of the mercies of God in which we live our daily lives. It is release from the prison of earthly expectations and dreams packed into a life before death. It is the only blessing of this mortal life that we take with us and which can never be taken from us. Everything else in life is fragile and tentative but the resurrection means our life in Christ is the most profound reality of life. Whether we live brief or long lives, whether we meet all our hopes and dreams out of this life, we belong to the Lord. Nothing can steal us from Him now and nothing can keep us from the unimaginable joy and wonder that is ours forevermore. That is what it means to say "Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed!"

FROM THE CANTOR



A Closer Look at a Hymn . . .

The crescendo to Easter morning has long been understood as a progression through death into life – and from darkness into the Light. Whereas the services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday

suspend with silence and darkness, the Great Vigil of Easter begins in the darkness of the tomb with the Paschal candle as the only light. That light spreads joyously as the news of Christ's resurrection rings free and clear for all to witness with mighty "Alleluias!" The estimable seventeenth-century Lutheran hymn writer (1707-76), Paul Gerhardt, must have had this progression in mind when he wrote his beloved Easter hymn, Awake, My Heart, With Gladness (LSB 467).

The German in the first stanza says it all: "Auf, auf! mein Herz," meaning "Up, up! My heart!" Rather than simply waking from a doze — Gerhardt calls on our hearts and bodies to leap "auf" from the grave! Indeed, where "my Savior there was laid," so also "our bed must be made," until "when to the realms of light our spirit wings its flight!" For "when Christ lay in the tomb," though the devil thought he was victorious, Christ "triumphed over the grave." And in this hope, we "cling forever to Christ, my Savior true" in faith, following "Him through all," knowing that "my Lord will leave me never, whatever He passes through." And so, since Christ has won the victory, our hearts can be content and untroubled. We view sadness and misery in this life as joy, and suffer the devil's onslaught as we are called to do for Christ's sake (vs. 5). In the end, we will be raised as Christ was, body and soul, and hear Christ's voice as Gerhardt summarizes in his stunning final stanza: "Who there My cross has shared finds here [in heaven] a crown prepared; Who there with Me has died shall here be glorified." Gerhardt's special touch is merging the Orthodox confession with personal language — notice the "my's" and "I's." After all, this glorious victory through Christ's cross and resurrection is not merely for His Church as a whole, but we may each lay hold of it as our very own certain promise and treasure.

"Notes" from the music desk . . .

Christ is risen, Alleluia! A blessed Easter to you all!


God gives us a voice for many reasons, but perhaps its best use is to sing! As Paul Westermeyer writes in his 1990 publication "To Be Human is to Sing", *The human race is driven to sing!* Babies and children instinctively cry – a form of song – and young ones later are drawn to children's songs as a way to tell stories, memorize things, and learn about the world. We don't hesitate to sing at baseball games, birthday parties, during the national anthem, or along with Taylor



Swift's latest and greatest hit releases. But. . . how often do we withhold our voices from their highest vocation – to sing God's praise, in church? God, after all, has given us our voices to confess Christ – in song, no less – crucified, risen, ascended, and glorified, for us!

Sure, we have reasons to avoid it – fatigue, not our preferred hymns, musical uncertainty, peer pressure or perhaps discouragement from a misguided musician of the past, to name a few. But let's be clear – Satan LOVES to hear our silence and passivity; he is ecstatic when God's elect sit in the pews, hymnals closed and voices idle, allowing others to confess the praise that should be their own.

My brothers and sisters, Christ is for you – and the song of the church does not belong to someone else. It is yours to carry. In heaven, everybody sings; there is no other option, nor do its occupants seek one. Faith in Christ is evidenced by how we confess Him, and indeed, by how we sing about Him. This Eastertide, I implore you to join in and sing (or bellow, shout, whisper, speak) the church's resurrection song – and leave uncertainty at the door. For Christ IS for us, He IS risen, and He is our Song.




"Mighty" Mites for Missions Minute:




NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE may come calling!

Thank you for continuing to pray for the Preschool.




